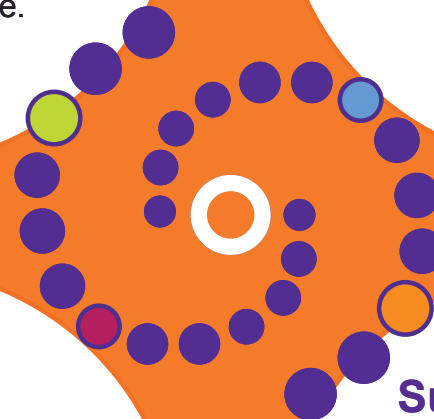
### Reduce carbon emissions and energy costs.
